Taras Shevchenko

March is dedicated to Taras Shevchenko. This is the time of year we celebrate the life of Taras as the 'Bard of Ukraine' (Великий Кобзар). Here are a few facts about his life:

- He lived for only 47 years,
- He spent 24 of these years as a serf to his master,
- He spent 11 years being investigated, tried, and imprisoned,
- He spent only 12 years as a free man,
- He wrote the first modern children's school 'primer' in the Ukrainian language,
- Well known for his poetry, he also produced over 1300 pieces of art (sketches, paintings, and engravings).
